






"Trust the People"

- 1995: Iperbole established "digital civic infrastructure"
- **2010:** Incredibol! supported cultural startups
- **2014:** New regulatory framework established collaboration pacts and Office of Active Citizenship
 - "Partecipa" social network utilized Iperbole to advance civic engagement
- **2017:** Civic Imagination Office created district labs to execute "proximity" approach
 - Participatory budgeting financed grassroots projects


Consider (for one or two of the initiatives)...

Five democratic goals of civic engagement



Four key design questions

Be clear what is and what is not within the **scope** of the effort.



Set transparent **goals** that help residents understand why you want to engage.



What happened next in Bologna?

- Investments in civic engagement and "civic imagination" supported resilience.
- Infrastructure of neighborhood labs and Iperbole proved important (a ready-made roster of engaged individuals who could help fellow residents).
- City facilitated contact between volunteers, non-profits, and those in need of service, and created a special permit for volunteers to leave homes to help others.
- Lepore focused on supporting the cultural sector.

A cooperative for local merchants and bicycle delivery workers delivered groceries, health supplies, library books, and other goods with support from the municipality and the Urban Innovation Foundation.



Participatory Budget

In late 2020, a revamped participatory budget initiative invited residents to vote for their preferred neighborhood project and their top priorities for public investment.

One million euros were allocated for selected projects and one million for future projects that advanced the chosen priorities.

Takeaways

- The *goals of civic engagement are broader than a given project or interaction*. Effective civic engagement can help city leaders strengthen relationships with the community, gather essential knowledge, mobilize resources, share decision-making power, and advance equity.
- Experimenting thoughtfully with new forms of engagement that
 remove barriers between city government and residents can help
 build trust and co-productive capacity.

Takeaways (cont.)

- There is no recipe for success in civic engagement but designing efforts with *clarity of purpose* and aligning goals, subjects, resident groups, and methods helps avoid disappointment.
- There are often multiple motivations to engage residents. Thinking about what success looks like and identifying meaningful metrics helps clarify a city's internal goals and those of its residents.
- The Participation Pathways framework can help structure
 conversations and design efforts as well as diagnose what works
 well and what could be improved in ongoing engagement efforts.
